Colorado Laws on Marriages

- Any minister may perform marriages. Couples themselves may solemnize their own marriage (C.R.S 14-2-109). They must apply for paper work from the County Courthouse in order to do this. However, friends or relatives cannot solemnize their marriage. Out-of-state Clergy may also solemnize marriages.
- A marriage license must be obtained from the county clerk:
 - The license is only valid within the State of Colorado.
 - There is no waiting period between applying & receiving license.
 - There is no waiting period to marry after receiving license.
 - The license is valid for 30 days.
 - No blood test is required.
 - A picture ID or government issued ID such as drivers license, visa, passport, state or military ID is required.
 - License Cost is \$20.
- The celebrant/officiate/minister must return the marriage certificate to the county clerk.
